Well, steps and stairs can still bring the pain, folks. Only for different reasons.


According to a study out of Palm Beach State College, 33,000 stair-related falls occur each year. If you think about it, most of these likely brought serious injury as well.

- 3) Avoid carrying packages and other things while on the stairs if at all possible.
