NEW AREA CODE PLANNED FOR ST. LOUIS AREA: St. Louis will be getting a new area code later this year, starting August 12th. The reason is that 314 area code numbers are running low, and will be exhausted by the third quarter of 2022. People who currently have the 314 area code will see no changes, but any new numbers will receive the new **557** area code overlay. This impacts the communities of St. Louis, Overland, Bridgeton, Florissant, Webster Groves, Creve Coeur, Kirkwood and Sappington. What it means for the St. Louis region is that we'll have to start dialing all 10 digits instead of just 7 digits, and get used to yet another area code. Happy dialing!
