LAFAYETTE INDUSTRIES 403(B) RETIREMENT PLAN

As an employee of Lafayette Industries, you are eligible to participate in the Lafayette Industries 403(b) Retirement Plan if you work 20 or more hours per week. Through payroll deduction you can contribute a portion of your pay (even as little as 1%) to your retirement savings account in the 403(b) plan.

For eligible employees who have been employed with Lafayette one year (with at least 1000 hours of service) and are age 21 or older, Lafayette will match your contribution, dollar for dollar up to the first 4%. This match *doubles* the amount of your investment (for the first 4%), and is a significant contribution to your retirement savings plan.

Representatives from Renaissance Financial will be onsite to answer investment questions you may have about your investments in your account in the Lafayette Industries' 403(b) Retirement Plan. If you're not currently an active participant in the plan, the representatives can answer your questions about this valuable benefit and provide enrollment documents.

ARE YOU READY FOR 10-DIGIT DIALING?: 314 area codes are going to run out by the end of the 3rd quarter this year, according to the Missouri Public Commission. In the meantime the cause for this change is not only the fact that they are running out of them, but is because the national 988 emergency suicide hotline is going to be activated in August. It's displacing a lot of area codes. 557 becomes the overlay for the 314 area codes in the St. Louis area, so that will be the new area code found in our area once they run out of 314s. What does all of this really mean for the rest of us? If they enforce 10-digit dialing, you will *have* to dial 10 digits in order to get through to the number you are dialing. Otherwise you will more than likely get a message that tells you to try again or that they aren't able to reach that number. Please plan ahead, as August is the planned date for the activation of the new area code, and that will give you lots of practice with 10-digit dialing. Good luck!

SAFETY THOUGHTS FOR APRIL 2022



Yes, my friends, sunglasses are more than just an accessory to the outfit we may be wearing. They can provide safety for our eyes as well as the rest of our person.

They are protection for our eyes from the sun's rays. The rays are electromagnetic radiation transmitted from the sun in waves. UV-rays can hurt vision and damage the retina of the eye. The

damaging rays can lead to macular degeneration or even cataracts. Therefore anyone heavily exposed to sunlight all day should wear sunglasses.

These damaging UV Rays are three times as severe in the summer as in the winter. Reflections off water or snow intensifies these rays more.

Buy glasses that remove 99% to 100% of the UV Rays. They should screen out 75% to 90% of visible light. Colors matter too. Each color (green, amber, grey, red, and mirrors) serves a different set of circumstances.

Take care regarding the medicines you take, as some of them make our eyes even more sensitive to light. There are safety sunglasses for those of us working outside as well. Safety glasses come with a numbering system that is in regard to a particular type of danger one might encounter.

Pack your glasses, folks!


SUMMER CLOTHING DRESS CODE – IMPORTANT!!
