



#### FAREWELL TO THE TAX MAN

The Lafayette Industries community has lost a valued family. Dick Kallemeier, his wife Ruth, and their daughter Leslie, who worked at Lafayette for nearly 37 years, have moved to Des Moines, Iowa to be close to their son and two granddaughters.

Most people know Kallemeier as the "Tax Man" — he prepared tax returns, pro bono, for Lafayette workers and their parents / guardians for the last 12

years — but there is much more to his story.

Kallemeier grew up in Bellefontaine Neighbors and went to Riverview Gardens High School. He graduated from Missouri Valley College in Marshall with a degree in history. He thought he would become a teacher, but Uncle Sam changed that plan.

"They were waiting for me to be drafted when I graduated from college," said Kallemeier, who lost his student deferment once he was out of college. Instead of waiting to get called by the Army, Kallemeier joined the Navy, where he became a line officer. "That's a term for someone who is supposed to be qualified for anything except fly an airplane."

Kallemeier spent five years on active duty — two and a half years on board a research vessel followed by two and a half years in Philadelphia, where he was a damage control instructor, focusing on nuclear, biological and chemical warfare defense.

After that, Kallemeier returned to St. Louis, where he re-affiliated with the Naval Reserve. In total, he served 28 years in the Naval Reserve, drilling one weekend each month and two weeks active duty every year at various Navy ships and commands. He retired with the rank of Captain.

Meanwhile, Kallemeier was hired by McDonnel Douglas in human resources. He was the director of human resources when he retired in 1995.

Two years later, he started volunteering as a tax preparer for AARP. His base was Salem Methodist Church in Ballwin, and some of his clients were parents of Lafayette workers.

"I thought, 'Why couldn't I do this at the workshop?" " said Kallemeier. He and Peter LaSalle became taxpreparing partners at Lafayette.

"The tax service at West started off slowly, but it gained steam," said Becky Stillwell, Lafayette's secretary / receptionist. "Now people rely on them for their taxes, and start asking in January when Dick's coming back."

Kallemeier estimates that he and LaSalle prepared an average of 70 to 80 tax returns a year. That number dropped in recent years during the Covid pandemic.

Asked what he will miss most about Lafayette, Kallemeier said, "I'll definitely miss working with the staff at the workshop. And, of course, the parents, of whom many became friends. I was their tax man. There was a relationship — and it's pretty personal because I knew a lot about them."

Stillwell said, "We appreciate all that you have done for us. We will miss you and your family more than you know."

Even though Kallemeier is gone, Lafayette parents, guardians, staff and workers will still be able to have their tax returns prepared for free. LaSalle will become the lead preparer and will be assisted by Ellen Lenox.



#### **MACHINES AND LAFAYETTE**

The transition over the years at Lafayette from a little warehouse and office in Valley Park to what it has become today is remarkable. There are simply no bounds on the love and responsibility we feel toward our employees. We just can't allow safety features to be ignored here. Nor shall we.
