#### WALGREENS FLU CLINICS UPDATE

We have spoken with Walgreens about the on-site flu clinic requirements. We have to have 50 people in place and guaranteed to get the shot in order for an on-site flu clinic to be held at a business location. Since West had 87 last year, we went ahead and set up the date for Thursday, October 13<sup>th</sup> from 9:00-11:00a. Please call Becky S. at 636-227-5666, x1100, and let us know the person who you want to sign up for the event. Walgreens said that family members are allowed to sign up as well for getting the shot here, if you want to do so. We will be getting a Walgreens form later that'll need to be filled out, and then a copy of your insurance card attached to it and returned to Becky S. at the front desk at West. It'll a requirement for everyone to fill it out. West folks - don't forget to call in to Becky S. to set up your appointment. If we don't reach 50 people, we'll have to cancel the clinic. Hope to hear from you.

We are also working hard to get North's numbers up to the required 50 people as well, so that we can set up the flu clinic there as well. As with West, North's family members are allowed to sign up for a flu shot and come to North, if you want to do so, *once we have the date established*. North will also be getting Walgreens paperwork later, and will need to attach a copy of the insurance card to attach their form as well. But first we have to get 50 people to sign up and guarantee they'll get the shot, and then we'll set up the date of the on-site flu clinic. We need to do this as soon as possible. We're trying to sign up for a date in October. North folks will need to call Jerry Phillips at 636-227-5666, x2101 or Sheila Zigrye at 636-227-5666, x2107, and let them know who being signed up, including any names of family members getting a shot. The sooner we get this done the better. We will keep you updated of any developments.

# **<u>SAFETY THOUGHTS FOR SEPTEMBER 2022</u>** by Tom Heitert (The Safety Guru)



#### THE 10 SECOND BALANCE TEST

An event which results in a person coming to rest inadvertently on the ground or floor or other lower level. Sounds harmless, doesn't it? That's the definition of a fall, the 2<sup>nd</sup> most cause of unintentional injury deaths each year worldwide. Yikes! It has been the leading cause of injury in workshops as far back as I remember. Lafayette has really worked at this, folk. Many of the rules on

the shop floor are directly related to this issue.

Many of our folk, staff and employees are at an age where recovery time from falls is extensive. What can WE do as individuals to protect ourselves? We can do certain activities to improve our balance.

Let's begin with 10 second balance test. Can you stand on one leg for ten seconds without falling? Recommend standing near a chair or wall for this. If you can, great! If you can't, let us work on it. Here are things we can do. Tai Chi is being recommended because it includes slow, controlled movements with deep breathing. I'm reading that it really helps people. There are classes everywhere.

Strengthening those leg muscles will help. How about dance classes? Even aerobics or yoga can benefit an individual. Folks, do SOMETHING. Falls have contributed to many a downward spiral. We really love you guys. So take care.
