### **SAFETY THOUGHTS FOR OCTOBER 2025**

Some time back, (Safety Captain says that a lot) there was a local newspaper sports columnist that wrote a column he called his "Bits". It had all his random thoughts from the week, that month, or whenever, that didn't fit in with his regular columns. I have such a column today. We shall call it 'Safety Captains Bits'.

- 1) Choking: The Heimlich Maneuver or abdominal thrust is simple and important for all of us to know. But if a person can still talk, cough, or breathe, it should NOT be done. Encourage victims to keep coughing. Those of us not involved should stay and get help if needed. The person choking doesn't care about privacy at that moment.
- 2) Sharing medicine meant for you: So many prescriptions are based on weight, age, and allergies. We can do harm to those we share with. And some medicines just don't mix. Finally, the recipients are masking symptoms of their illness, making it difficult for a doctor or Nurse Practitioner to help them.
- 3) Front burner: Keep the boiling pots and pans on the back burner. Children WILL reach up and grab them. 1/3 of burn injuries are children. 61% of those are under 5 years old.
- 4) Petting strange dogs: The American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA) says that 3 of 5 dog bite victims are from the family dog or the neighborhoods family dogs. Best to just say hello.
