SAFETY THOUGHTS FOR OCTOBER 2025

HOT WATER

One Sunday morning some years back, the old Safety Captain's 'Better Half' was about to take a shower. By habit, she and most of the rest of us get in the shower and then turn it on. Fortunately, on this morning, she turned on the hot water first. The hot water faucet exploded out of the wall, hitting the back wall of the shower. The stream of hot water was like a firehose. She would never have been able to get out of there without severe burns.

Approximately every minute a person is burned seriously enough in the United States to require medical attention. Imagine my surprise when I find out that 41% of inspected homes have dangerously high-water temperatures. Hot water will burn skin at much lower temperatures than the boiling point (212 degrees). It takes only 3 minutes to burn someone at 140 degrees seriously enough to require surgery.

So set your water heater at 120 degrees or just below the 'Medium' setting. A safe bathing temperature is 100 degrees.
